COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is a one-hour pass-fail online course that satisfies half of Clemson University's academic and professional development requirements for political science majors. All assignments will be distributed online via Canvas® and should be turned in to the instructor via Canvas®. Please note the intensity of this course, due to condensing a semester's-worth of material into just a few short weeks!

OBJECTIVES: This course is designed for senior political science majors. Through active engagement, students will:

- Reflect on what they have learned and accomplished during their college education—particularly as a Political Science major
- Devote some time to assessing their future career plans, including preparing a formal resume and cover letter
- Explore cross-disciplinary issues, current research, career options, and ethical issues related to the study of political science.

REQUIRED READING: There is no required text for this course.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS: Final grades consist of the following components:

Three Online Assignments (75%)

There are three online assignments that will be posted and submitted via Canvas®. Each assignment is out of 100 points and is worth 25% of your total course grade. Details for each assignment are available in the "Assignments" folder on the "Modules" page of Canvas®. Assignments must be turned in no later than their assigned date; see the late policy below. You are highly encouraged to get things completed and out of the way as early as possible.

Submission of Best POSC Paper Written for a Previous Class (12.5%)

This assignment simply requires you to submit what you deem to be the "best" paper you have written in a previous political science class. Students must first review the "Best Paper Rubric" posted on Canvas; submissions that do not seem to follow the criteria will be deleted and students will be

required to submit a different, more appropriate paper. **Note that this assignment is not asking for the paper on which you received the highest grade, but instead one that exemplifies your best mastery of political science concepts, critical thinking, applied research, assertive and evidence-based argumentation, writing, and proper citation practices.** The paper will not be re-graded anew; rather, it will be used in the department's self-assessment and for re-accreditation purposes. Please upload your chosen paper as a Word document on Canvas no later than Wednesday, July 26th at 11:59pm.

Completion of a Senior Survey (12.5%)

The Department of Political Science at Clemson University conducts this senior survey to gather information about our graduating students with an eye toward improving the education we offer to our majors. (There is an additional, separate "exit survey" the department will administer immediately prior to graduation.) The answers you provide will be kept strictly anonymous and will be considered in the aggregate only. Completing the Senior Survey is worth 9% of your final grade. The deadline to complete the survey is Friday, August 4th at 11:59pm.
